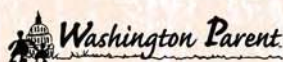

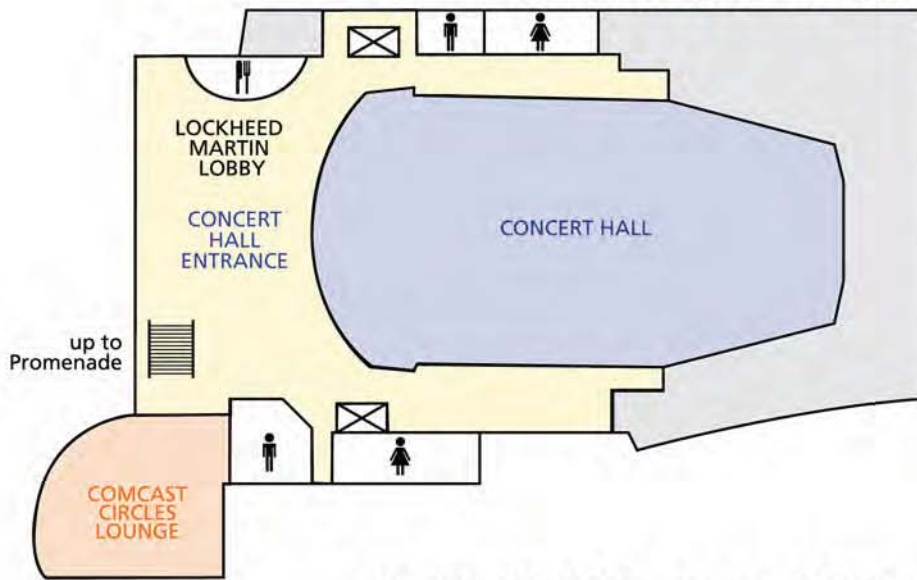

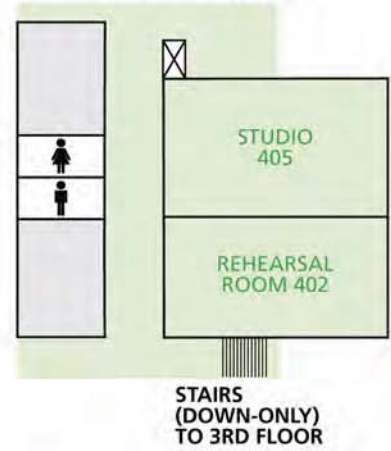

# MAP OF STRATHMORE

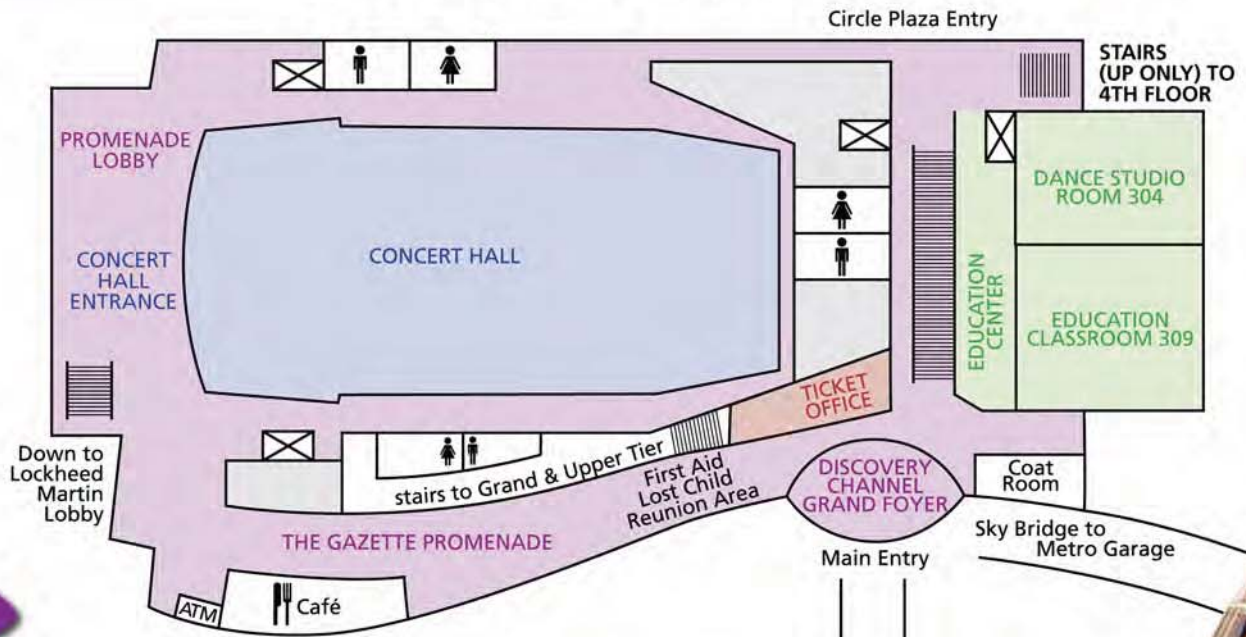
## ORCHESTRA LEVEL—1st floor



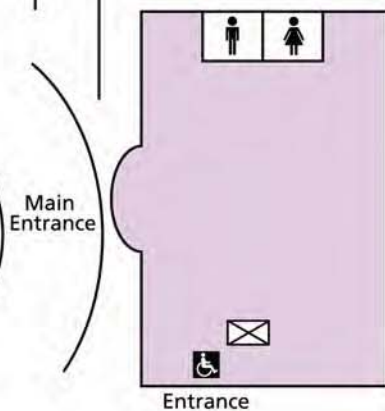
## EDUCATION CENTER—4TH FLOOR
